#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Adopt Resolution 24/25.06 to approve the Transportation Development Act (TDA) Fiscal Year (FY) 2023/24 State of Good Repair (SGR) Funds Actual Allocation and Claim.

#### **BACKGROUND and DISCUSSION**

The Transportation Development Act provides three funding sources:

- 1. LTF from a guarter cent of the general sales tax collected statewide
- 2. STA from the statewide sales tax on diesel fuel
- 3. SGR fund from a portion of the Transportation Improvement Fee created from Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017

The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration, based on sales tax collected in each county, returns the general sales tax revenues to each county's LTF. The State Controller's Office appropriates and allocates STA and SGR tax revenue, by formula, to planning agencies and other selected agencies.

The El Dorado County Transportation Commission is the Regional Transportation Planning Agency responsible for apportioning and administering the TDA funds for the Western Slope of El Dorado County.

The SGR is a funding source from a portion of the SB 1 Transportation Improvement Fee. The actual amount received for FY 2023/24 is \$309,544.00 plus \$5,459.80 in interest and EI Dorado County Transit Authority (EDCTA) is the only eligible recipient on the Western Slope of El Dorado County. EDCTA's approved 2023/24 SGR project is Repair and Rehabilitation and Vehicle Replacement. EDCTA will consider approval of a claim for this project on October 3, 2024, in the amount of \$315,003.80 to be submitted to the EI Dorado County Transportation Commission for payment.

## **RESOLUTION 24/25.06**

## RESOLUTION OF THE EL DORADO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION APPROVING THE TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT FISCAL YEAR 2023/24 STATE OF GOOD REPAIR FUNDS ACTUAL ALLOCATION AND CLAIM

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to California Government Code, Title 7.95, Section 67950, the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) was created as a local planning agency to provide regional transportation planning for the area of El Dorado County, exclusive of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and

**WHEREAS,** California Government Code Section 29532.1(g) identifies EDCTC as the designated Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) for El Dorado County, exclusive of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and is responsible for the planning, allocating and/or programming of funds and administration of the Transportation Development Act of 1971 (TDA), as amended thereafter; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of El Dorado, the City of Placerville, and the El Dorado County Transit Authority (EDCTA) are each required to file annual transportation claims for the funds, if any, from the Local Transportation Fund (LTF) of the Western Slope of the County, as apportioned to them by the EDCTC, pursuant to the TDA; and

*WHEREAS*, it is the responsibility of the EDCTC, under the provisions of the TDA, to review the annual transportation claims and to make allocations of monies from the LTF, State Transit Assistance (STA) fund and State of Good Repair (SGR) fund based on the estimated revenue upon approving said claim; and

*WHEREAS*, the SGR fund was established due to funding from Senate Bill (SB) 1, The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017; and

*WHEREAS*, the State Controller's Office issued a report of the estimated revenues for SGR funds; and

*WHEREAS*, on June 1, 2023, the EDCTC authorized Repair and Rehabilitation as the primary project and Vehicle Replacement as a backup project to be funded by the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023/24 SGR Program; and

*WHEREAS*, the FY 2023/24 SGR fund estimated allocation of \$297,741.00 was approved at the EDCTC meeting on May 4, 2023; and

*WHEREAS*, the State Controller's Office issued the FY 2023/24 SGR fund report of the actual amount received of \$309,544.00; and

WHEREAS, interest earned in the SGR fund for FY 2023/24 was \$5,459.80; and

WHEREAS, the EDCTA is the only eligible applicant; and

*WHEREAS*, the EDCTA will consider approval of a claim for Repair and Rehabilitation on October 3, 2024, in the amount of \$315,003.80 to be submitted to EDCTC for payment; and

*WHEREAS*, the Auditor of said County is instructed to pay monies in the fund to the claimants pursuant to allocation instructions received from the EDCTC.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** the SGR funds are reserved in a designated account by the Auditor's Office until a reimbursement claim from EDCTA has been approved by the Commission.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that EDCTC shall review the claims as they are received, approve same for the FY 2023/24 funds available in the SGR fund, and make the following allocation:

1. **State of Good Repair** – To be paid to El Dorado County Transit Authority in the amount of \$315,003.80 for Repair and Rehabilitation, per Sections 99313 and 99314.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that allocation instructions shall be prepared for each claimant in accordance with the above, and pursuant to EDCTC rules and regulations. The Executive Director, appointed by the Commission, is authorized to sign the allocation instructions and to issue the instructions to the County Auditor to pay the claimant in accordance with the above allocations and conditions.

## **REQUESTED ACTION**

Adopt Resolution 24/25.07 approving the Transportation Development Act Fiscal Year (FY) 2023/24 Actual Apportionment and Allocation for State Transit Assistance Funds.

## **BACKGROUND and DISCUSSION**

The Transportation Development Act (TDA) provides three funding sources:

- 1. Local Transportation Fund (LTF) from a quarter cent of the general sales tax collected statewide.
- 2. State Transit Assistance fund (STA) from the statewide sales tax on diesel fuel.
- 3. State of Good Repair (SGR) from a portion of the Transportation Improvement Fee included in Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.

The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration, based on sales tax collected in each county, returns the general sales tax revenues to each county's LTF. The State Controller's Office (SCO) allocates the STA tax and the State of Good Repair revenue, by formula, to planning agencies and other eligible agencies. Statute requires that 50% of STA and SGR funds be allocated according to population and 50% be allocated according to operator revenues from the prior fiscal year.

The El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) is the Regional Transportation Planning Agency responsible for apportioning and administering these funds for this region. The attached Findings of Apportionment summarizes the actual amount received for FY 2023/24.

#### State Transit Assistance Funds (STA)

The final actual amount of FY 2023/24 actual STA funds received was \$2,167,653.00 and interest earned in the fund was \$2,909.14. The STA funds were paid to El Dorado County Transit Authority who is the only eligible applicant.

#### RESOLUTION OF THE EL DORADO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION APPROVING THE TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT FISCAL YEAR 2023/24 FINAL APPORTIONMENT AND ALLOCATION FOR STATE TRANSIT ASSISTANCE FUNDS

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to California Government Code, Title 7.95, Section 67950, the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) was created as a local planning agency to provide regional transportation planning for the area of El Dorado County, exclusive of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and

**WHEREAS,** California Government Code Section 29532.1(g) identifies EDCTC as the designated Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) for El Dorado County, exclusive of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and is responsible for the planning, allocating and/or programming of funds and administration of the Transportation Development Act of 1971 (TDA), as amended thereafter; and

*WHEREAS*, the County of El Dorado, the City of Placerville, and the El Dorado County Transit Authority are each required to file annual transportation claims for the funds, if any, from the Local Transportation Fund (LTF), the State Transit Assistance Fund (STA) and the State of Good Repair Fund (SGR) of the Western Slope of the County, as apportioned to them by the EDCTC, pursuant to the TDA; and

*WHEREAS*, it is the responsibility of the EDCTC, under the provisions of the TDA, to review the annual transportation claims and to make allocations of monies from the LTF, STA, and SGR funds based on the estimated revenue upon approving said claim; and

*WHEREAS*, the Auditor of said County is instructed to pay monies in the fund to the claimants pursuant to allocation instructions received from the El Dorado County Transportation Commission; and

*WHEREAS*, the State Controller's Office issued a report of estimated revenues for STA Funds in January 2023 and a revised estimate in August 2023; and

*WHEREAS*, the State Controller's Office issued a final report of revenues for FY 2023/24 STA and the actual amount was \$2,167,653.00.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the EI Dorado County Transportation Commission shall approve the FY 2023/24 actual amount received in the STA fund, and make the following allocations:

1. <u>State Transit Assistance Funds</u> – To the El Dorado County Transit Authority (EDCTA) for State Transit Assistance Funds in the final amount of \$2,167,653.00 for FY 2023/24 and interest earned in the fund was \$2,909.14. The total amount is \$2,170,562.14.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, the El Dorado County Transportation Commission has requested that approved claims be paid in full, provided the funds are available.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that allocation instructions shall be prepared for each claimant in accordance with the above, and pursuant to the El Dorado County Transportation Commission rules

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and regulations. The Executive Director, appointed by the Commission, is authorized to sign the allocation instructions and to issue the instructions to the County Auditor to pay the claimants in accordance with the above allocations and conditions.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the claimants are to be notified by the El Dorado County Transportation Commission of action on their claims.

## **REQUESTED ACTION**

#### BACKGROUND

#### DISCUSSION

The El Dorado Trail Missouri Flat Road Bicycle and Pedestrian Overcrossing project includes \$90,000 for plans, specifications and estimates (PS&E) and \$100,000 for construction.

El Dorado County DOT submitted a claim on September 13, 2024, requesting reimbursement of \$90,000.00 for this project.

Payment of the attached claim will be made by the El Dorado County Auditor-Controller's office from the TDA/LTF Bicycle and Pedestrian fund.

*WHEREAS*, in 2020 EDCTC programmed \$190,000 in TDA/LTF Pedestrian and Bicycle Funds to the Missouri Flat Road Overcrossing project to support a Cycle 5 grant application through the Active Transportation Program; and

*WHEREAS*, the project was not awarded Cycle 5 Active Transportation Program funding, however, the project remains a high priority and EDCTC and El Dorado County DOT continue to pursue competitive funding opportunities to obtain construction funding for the project; and

**WHEREAS,** the EDCTC is programming \$190,000 in TDA/LTF Pedestrian and Bicycle Funds to the Missouri Flat Road Overcrossing project in order to reduce the construction funding need and support any future competitive funding opportunities; and

*NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED*, that the El Dorado County Transportation Commission approves the programming of \$190,000 in TDA/LTF Pedestrian and Bicycle Funds to the Missouri Flat Road Bicycle and Pedestrian Overcrossing Project.

The total amount of Amendment 1 to the FY 2024/25 OWP and Budget is \$1,856,143.21.
